

EVF 2016 Donation Guidelines

Flea Market:

The good stuff you no longer need: household goods, toys, games, tools, small electronics, sports equipment, etc. All items should be clean, sellable, have working parts and be in good condition.

Finer Fleas: We will do our best to get a good price for any more valuable items that you donate. If we can get a better price at a public auction, we will sell it that way.

Please no: clothing, computers, monitors, computer accessories, TVs, sofas, beds, wooden crutches, knives, skis, or large exercise equipment.

Books, DVDs, and CDs

We'd love all the books, music, and movies you no longer want or have space for. *Please no* textbooks or computer manuals, or books with mold or mildew.

Children's Books

Gently used board books, picture books, beginning readers, chapter books and non-fiction are all welcome – hardcover and paperback.

Please no: torn or missing covers or pages, moldy books, books that are written-in or with parts used up, as we are unable to sell these.

Flea Market Drop Off Guidelines

Donations to the Flea Market can be dropped off at the Follen Community Center:

- Sunday Sept 25: 2 pm to 5 pm
- Monday Sept 26 through Thursday Sept 29: 9 am to 5pm and 7 to 9pm

No donations accepted after Thursday September 29.

Jewelry

Yes! Please donate your unwanted or unworn jewelry. A group of dedicated volunteers will polish and mark it. You may bring your jewelry to Sarah Garner in the Church Office as soon as you are able but no later than Tuesday September 27.

Baked Goods

Please wrap bars, squares, and brownies individually, as they sell better that way. Cookies can be bagged in groups of 4 or 6. Pies, cakes, and breads are welcome. Please wrap and label all baked goods as to identity, with a listing of any excluded ingredients that might affect allergies: nut-free, wheat-free, sugar-free, and gluten-free. Please use plastic bags or cling wrap, not aluminum foil.

- Friday Sept 30 from 6 to 7pm or
- Saturday Oct 1 from 7:30 to 9:30am

Plants

We welcome unusual and common varieties of perennials. Please label them with the name of the plant, sun or shade requirements, color and height if possible.

We welcome:

- potted ferns, perennial flowers, hostas, daylilies, irises, herbs of all sorts
- shrubs such as rhododendrons, grasses, or any healthy perennial
- labeled, healthy house plants, to be delivered the morning of the Fair
- garden/plant related items, and tools in good condition

Plant Donation Drop Off Guidelines

- Beginning Sunday, September 11, empty pots for plants may be dropped off or picked up in Marshman Center and the side of Follen.
- Beginning Sunday, September 18, Potted and labeled perennials may be dropped off between Marshman Center and the Church, and leading up to the day before EVF.
- Beginning Sunday, September 25 after 2 PM – Gardening-related items in good condition (tools, accessories) may be labeled as “Plant & Garden Table” and delivered to the Flea Market in the Community Center.
