# *In the Interim*

Last spring, the folks who had participated in Follen's Stewardship Re-Think approached the Worship and Music Action Team with a question: After the offering has been collected during Sunday worship, could the collection be presented to the minister for "acceptance with gratitude"? WMAT folks were very interested in discussing this with us ministers to consider what a change in current procedures might mean.

What happens right now?" you may wonder. "And, does it really matter what we do with the money after it has been collected?" What happens right now is that, after the ushers collect the offering, it is tallied and then put in the administrator's office for safe-keeping. A wise practice. But, what about keeping our offering in the sanctuary and acknowledging it front and center? What about giving thanks for the abundance you have just shared? Does the current practice of removing the offering after it has been collected in any way reflect a general discomfort at Follen with things that are money-related?

The people involved in last spring's Stewardship Re-Think feel that there is room for growth here. In their excellent and comprehensive report from the Re-Think process, they stated that Follenites (along with many other UU congregations) are in general reluctant to talk about money. "As long as we give," you might ask, "does it matter?" Well, yes it does, because discomfort with money-related matters can ultimately limit a congregation's ongoing ministries and its potential for new ministries. As Tricia shared in her sermon this past Sunday, "Finances and vision are powerfully interwoven." If folks can't openly talk about money – an essential resource to support ministries – then that will impact the ability to dream big about how this congregation can better serve one another and the larger world.

Bringing the offering forward on Sunday morning to be received and blessed by the minister may seem like a small thing. However, we hope that you will embrace its symbolism. We don't want to worship money, but we do want give thanks for your gifts and acknowledge giving as a central part of our religious practice. We want to name and acknowledge money for the essential resource that it is in supporting the life and ministry of this congregation. So, see how it feels as we try something new. The folks on WMAT, along with Tricia and me, will be looking for your feedback.

Here's to a healthier, more open relationship with money for all of us in the new year.

# From the Membership Coordinator

## *Caring, Connection and Community....*

When I think about my work here at Follen, I think about the importance of making connections with people, and the impact it may have on their life's journey. Giving of one's self to others may be seen as part of a spiritual practice. Listening to someone's story or concern without judgment, saying hello and seeking out someone for conversation may seem like a small gesture, but has the potential for making a huge difference in someone's day.

Friends or acquaintances will sometimes inquire about my position as membership coordinator at Follen, asking how I like it, as it is SO different from my work in health care and health education. My usual response is that it is NOT so different. I am still involved in outreach (and "in reach"). I still have an opportunity to design and implement workshops, collaborate with colleagues and hopefully have a positive impact on those seeking to connect with the Follen Community.

One of the things that is so difficult about working in health education and health promotion is that one never knows what impact a conversation, a workshop, an educational flyer or poster will have on both short term and long term behavior change for an individual. In other words, it's hard to measure "outcome." There is not the same satisfaction one feels as a clinician treating someone for "strep" throat with an antibiotic and seeing a rapid improvement in health status. I have had the satisfaction, however, of being contacted by former students who have told me that a workshop I presented or a conversation I had with them did compel them to seek medical care for a specific health problem or to begin a process of changing their attitude toward alcohol or a negative body image, for example.

I often think about this process when I meet someone new (or not so new) on a Sunday morning. A person may have come because they are "church shopping", or because a friend or neighbor invited them or they looked on our website and decided to "check us out." Maybe they were at Follen a year ago, but weren't ready to make a commit-

ment to joining the community, but now they are. I never know.

What I do know is that the warm smile and greeting on the part of our hosts and other members of the community does have a positive impact or "outcome" on those entering our doorway. Inviting a new person sitting next to us in the pew to coffee hour or introducing ourselves to someone we don't know at coffee hour is such a simple act that can make a huge difference for someone who is feeling a bit "lost in the crowd" or is shy, or going through a difficult time. Introducing a newcomer to someone in the community who shares similar interests may be the vital connection for them that sparks their motivation to return to Follen. For all of us a connection begins with caring, and perhaps that connection will add another member to our community.

If you would like a more formal role in the "connection process", please consider being a host! It involves greeting people on Sunday morning and follow-up with conversations at coffee hour and/or introducing them to other people at Follen who may share their interests. It's a great way to meet people and to advertise all the great things Follen has to offer.

During late November and December, the Ministerial Search Committee received and pored over the Ministerial Records of applicants. You'll be glad to know that interest in our congregation drew a relatively large applicant pool. From this pool, the committee asked to exchange information packets with a smaller group of ministers, and eventually, to conduct video interviews with a smaller number still, via Skype.

We now look forward to several intense weekend visits (Friday evening to Sunday afternoon) with the ministers we have selected to be "pre-candidates." One highlight of these pre-candidating visits will be the opportunity to observe these ministers each conduct a service and preach at a neutral (undisclosed) pulpit.

Thanks to all of you for your support, patience and good humor during this delicate and confidential process. We're a long way from completing the search, but we continue to be very optimistic that it will culminate in us welcoming a wonderful new minister for Follen!



## Cardigan Lodge Weekend February 8 - February 10, 2013



There is still time to sign up for Follen's Cardigan Lodge weekend, a winter get-away for all in the mountains of New Hampshire.

### What is Cardigan Lodge?

Built by the AMC as one of New Hampshire's first ski lodges, Cardigan Lodge is set on a 1200 acre reservation owned and managed by the AMC. The lodge is surrounded by an extensive trail network for hiking and cross-country skiing. Inside the lodge, there is a large living room with a fireplace, a downstairs library and a pack-room for outdoor gear. The on-site store offers books, maps, logo gear and last-minute items. Friendly staff provides weather and trail information. In addition to outdoor activities, the weekend includes three days of group meals and lots of time to converse and relax.

### What happens at Cardigan Lodge Weekend?

On Friday evening, arrivals trickle in, have dinner and settle into their rooms. At Saturday breakfast the day's activities are planned. Outdoor activities include hiking, cross country skiing, snowshoeing or sledding. If you like to downhill ski, there is usually a group going to nearby Ragged Mountain. If you prefer, you may spend the day reading or knitting by the fire. In the evenings, after 'happy hour' and dinner, you may play board games or take part in a group game of charades. This weekend is a great opportunity to get to know other Follenites. Single adults, couples and families are all welcome. Youth are encouraged to attend as long as they are accompanied by an adult!


## Life Planning for Adults with Special Needs

Do you have an adult or late-teenaged family member with a condition that causes limitations of major life activities such as self-care, language, learning, mobility or self-direction which results in a diminished capacity for fully independent living and economic self-sufficiency? Last year, the Caring Congregation Committee (CCC) facilitated a brainstorming session with such family members to gather ideas for how Follen might more effectively support them. As a result of this session, the CCC is offering a workshop to support parents and other family members in creating a life plan for their family member. Each participant will work on the development of their own plan within the supportive setting of the group. Topics will include financial, housing, vocational, social, medical, legal, family and community resources. The series will be a combination of exercises within the group and presentations by experts. We plan eight weekly sessions during March and April. The time and dates will be determined by the availability of people who are interested in participating. 
After our worship service, we will celebrate the generosity of our scholarship donors and the Follen community by hosting a luncheon.
