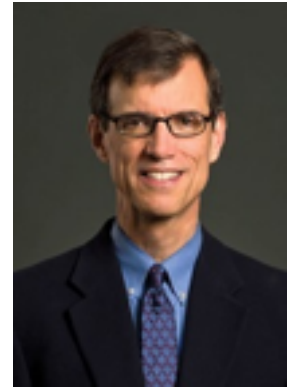


“Requiem for the American Dream”
